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Dear Applicant:

Welcome to the beginning of what I hope will be one of the most memorable experiences of your life. Taller Portobelo Norte was created as a way for multidisciplinary artists throughout the United States to stay connected, share exhibition and career development information and help further the critical discussion and examination of the art and cultures of the African Diaspora, especially as they are manifested in Latin America and the Caribbean. To this end, we have created a year round roster of cultural trips and workshops, of which the **2010 Taller Portobelo Norte Summer Art Colony** is one.

This package is your first step on your journey to Portobelo. It contains TPN Summer Art Colony Information, Submission Requirements, Personal Statement, Application Form, Request for References and the Application Checklist. You will also be required to forward a photocopy of a valid US passport and/or valid Green Card, and drivers license before we depart.

Once we receive your application, the selection committee will review your proposal, work samples and references and notify you of their decision within two weeks. If you are accepted into the program, you will receive an acceptance packet containing a Packing List, Applicant Health Statement, Medical Waiver and optional Credit Card Authorization form.

The number of spaces available at Taller Portobelo Norte is limited, so I urge you to complete the application requirements prior to the **March 19th** deadline. Late applications will not be accepted. The initial deposit is nonrefundable, so please be sure you are dedicated to attending before you apply.

As a grassroots arts organization, TPN does not at this time have the funding to offer scholarships and grants for attendance. All applicants are encouraged to seriously consider whether they are able to make this financial investment in their artistic practice.

Please use the Application Checklist to keep yourself up to date with your application. If you fail to send all of the materials as well as the program fee on time you will forfeit your place at Taller Portobelo Norte.

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TPN Summer Art Colony Eligibility Requirements:

In 2010, Taller Portobelo Norte is offering artists 2 or 3 week residencies in Portobelo, Panama. We invite artists of all disciplines and media to submit project proposals for work to be developed during the 14 or 21 day residency. Keeping in mind that the residencies are only 2 or 3 weeks long, our goal is to support artists in realizing works-in-progress and the production of new, small works.

Although we ask for a project proposal, we encourage participants to think of this as a loose plan and come ready to create work without a predetermined agenda or schedule. A big part of the value of this artistic experience is a high level of interaction with peers and the local community. We aim to provide a space for visionary artists whose work stimulates and expands artistic boundaries and conventions to create work that challenges themselves and gives voice to their ideas.

TPN Summer Art Colony participants are selected based on their dedication to their art practice, artistic innovation, and craftsmanship. TPN encourages both collaborative and independent projects as ways to create a positive multicultural artistic exchange. Artists interested in working with Panamanian artists on a collaborative project should indicate as such in their proposal. Knowledge of Spanish is encouraged for collaborative projects - though is not mandatory.

This opportunity offers unique potential for artistic experience and production. Portobelo offers a non-traditional approach to art practice. "Studio space"/"work space" not only include Taller Portobelo facilities, but also the colonial forts surrounding the town, the open plaza, and other designated experimental spaces. As would be the case with more conventional spaces, artists shall return the spaces they use to create and exhibit work to the same condition that they found it.

We encourage all art forms from improvisational street performance and puppetry to video installation, painting, and poetry. Sound designers may find a particular inspiration in the soundscape of Portobelo. From the waters of the Caribbean Sea to soccer games in the plaza, to the songs and drumbeats that animate a local performance tradition called "Congo," the town provides rich multi-sensory inspiration. Art Colony participants are encouraged to experiment with unconventional approaches to produce and display their projects.

Artists shall supply his/her own tools and materials necessary in completing the work. If you have special requirements for installation or performance, please indicate so in your proposal.

Taller Portobelo Norte Summer Art Colony measures its success by the level of creative excellence and cultural exchange that it contributes to an already thriving artistic community and encourages artists to reach beyond the boundaries of any one discipline to expand the possibilities of artistic vision.



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TPN Summer Art Colony Information:

Founded in 1997 by Dr. Arturo Lindsay, a Panamanian born artist and Professor of Art and Art History, in conjunction with Spelman College in Atlanta, GA, the Spelman College Summer Art Colony laid the foundation for our current model. Since then, the Taller Portobelo Norte Summer Art Colony has attracted artists, scholars and students from throughout the country interested in the visual and performing arts and cultures of the African Diaspora, ethnographic and anthropological research, Spanish and Latin American Studies, and responsible and ethical tourism.

Accommodations:

All programs of Taller Portobelo Norte are housed at Taller Portobelo, an artist cooperative in the town of Portobelo, on the Caribbean coast of the Republic of Panama, unless otherwise noted. The Taller Portobelo complex consists of three guest houses and a small gallery and workshop. All rooms are multi-occupancy. Taller Portobelo rents additional housing in the town for overflow participants.

Our goal is to create an environment of cultural immersion, not one of touristic voyeurism.

The insects and amphibians of the surrounding rainforest also live in our small complex. The cool breezes of the Caribbean Sea make air conditioning unnecessary. The warm temperatures of the land also make it unnecessary for hot water in the showers. During the rainy season (May through November) there is an abundance of flies, mosquitoes and frogs to contend with. Rooms are furnished with fans and mosquito nets. Participants are encouraged to bring whatever creature comforts (i.e. favorite pillows, cd players, etc.) they feel might help them feel more "at home" in the space.

Meals:

The Taller Portobelo Staff, consisting of Dona Ceci and her assistants Soledad and Sofia, create two traditional Caribbean meals per day. Breakfast usually consists of any of the following: eggs, bread, pancakes, fruit, juice, tea and coffee. Lunch, traditionally the largest meal of the day, consists of any of the following: rice, fish/chicken and vegetables and/or salad. Participants with dietary restrictions should bring or be prepared to buy the supplies that they need for the duration of the trip.

Please indicate on your application if you have a dietary restriction so that we can help you prepare. The third meal of the day is the responsibility of the participant. There is a full kitchen at Taller Portobelo for the use of the participants. There are also grocery stores and many inexpensive restaurants (\$5-\$15) in Portobelo.

Language:

The language of Panama is Spanish. All critiques will be conducted in English and translators will be available as needed. We encourage all participants to learn, at a minimum, a basic vocabulary in Spanish. This not only endears you to the local community, but will also help you to build more meaningful, independent relationships in the town.



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Currency:

The US dollar is used as legal tender in the Republic of Panama. As a result, there is no need for currency exchange. There are ATM machines in Panama City as well as in Sabanitas, which is a 45 minute bus ride from Portobelo. Credit Cards, Check and Travelers Checks are not accepted in Portobelo.

Passports & Visas or Tourist Cards:

United States citizens are required to have a valid passport and a visa or tourist card in order to enter the Republic of Panama. \$5 Visa/Tourist cards are available upon checking in for departure at your gate or de-boarding the plane at Tocumen Airport in Panama City.

Eligibility:

Taller Portobelo Norte defines art broadly enough to encompass a myriad of disciplines. Past participants have run the gamut from painters, sculptors and video artists to fashion designers, writers, storytellers and dancers. We are open to project proposals from artists working in any creative medium.

Trip Fee:

\$1425 for 2 week residency
\$2245 for 3 week residency

As a grassroots arts organization, TPN does not have the funding to offer scholarships and grants for attendance. Again, all applicants are encouraged to seriously consider whether they are able to make this financial investment in their artistic practice.

Fee Includes:

- Ground transportation between Airport & Portobelo
- Multi-occupancy room
- 2 daily meals at Taller Portobelo
- Tour of historic Portobelo
- Guided critiques

Not Included:

- Round trip Airfare
- Meals outside of Taller Portobelo
- Art Supplies
- Souvenirs and incidentals

Additional Trip Options:

Taller Portobelo Norte offers participants to visit Panama City, The Panama Canal, The Colon Duty Free Zone, and Isla Grande beaches for an additional fee. More information on these side trips will be forwarded upon acceptance of your application.



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TPN Summer Art Colony Requirements:

The following must be included with your application *and labeled as such*:

1. Project Proposal

Submit a detailed description of your proposed project. Describe project ideas, goals and materials needed. Be sure to include any special needs that you may have such as materials that have to be acquired on the ground in Panama or studio assistants. **Be innovative and creative.** Special consideration will be given to proposals that engage the local community through interactive workshops/performances or use the local culture and tradition as inspiration.

NOTE: In your proposal please describe how the images/samples you are submitting relate to the proposed project. (i.e. related prior work or work in progress) We only accept images/samples of current original works produced within the last 3 years in all categories.

2. Work Samples

Visual Artists: A CD or DVD of 20 individual JPEGS **named as** Lastname_Firstinitial_number. (Example Hammons_D_01.jpg). File size is a maximum of 1MB each.

Literary Artists: Up to three samples of prose pieces (essays, short stories, etc.) and/or up to four poems on CD. Excerpts of longer prose pieces are welcome as long as the author provides context(s) in his/her cover letter. Total submissions should not exceed 15 pages (12 point, times roman font). Poems may be single spaced. Prose must be double-spaced. Please include a cover letter listing the titles of the submitted works, and detailing all relevant contact information for the author, including an e-mail address if available. All subsequent pages should include page numbers and the author's first initial, last name and work title. Work may only be submitted on a CD via mail.

Video: One DVD which plays both on a Mac computer and DVD player. There must be a menu to move between tracks or scenes. Alternatively use QuickTime files on a CD.

Audio: One CD, which plays both on a Mac and CD player. We will review up to 5 min. of AV material. Judges will be assessing a body of work and therefore encourage artists to include the best work to complement your proposal.

Other: Send slides, CD and/or DVD of at least 10 examples of your work. Please be sure that all work is clearly identified and/or labeled.

3. Work Sample List

The list should include title, medium, dimensions and year created. List should correspond to your file names, Video and Audio work.

4. Artist's statement and Biography

Describe your artistic outlook and practice and personal and professional history. This should be no more than two single spaced pages.



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5. Current resume/CV

A resume/CV with a 2008 or 2009 degree should include the month of graduation.

6. Personal Statement

(not to exceed 1 single-sided, 12 point font, single-spaced page)

This is your opportunity to give us a snapshot of who you are as an individual, the major issues that interest/vex you, and how that shapes your artistic practices. How have you come to this point along your journey and how might the land, people, and/or culture of the small Afro-Latin community of Portobelo, Panama impact your work? How has an engagement of African/Black Diaspora, Caribbean, and/or Latin American art and culture informed your previous work and/or worldview? Beyond your project, what are the personal goals you hope to accomplish by participating in this particular artist retreat?

The selection committee is especially interested in applicants who are willing to immerse themselves in this unique experience.

7. References

Please forward three sealed letters of reference on official letterhead from professional and/or academic sources that address the following topics:

- Applicant's artistic/scholastic preparedness to participate in a cultural/artistic exchange
- Applicant's ability to adapt to different cultural environments/situations and peoples
- Applicant's talent and potential for growth from this experience
- Any other factors which you believe may have a bearing on the candidate's success in this program

NOTE: *Recommendations that do not reference the topics stated above will be disregarded.*

8. Deposit Payment

A non-refundable deposit of \$250 is due with the application. This deposit will only be returned if you are not selected for the 2010 Artist Colony.

9. Completed Application Form

NOTE: *Your COMPLETE application must in the office by March 19th.* We will not accept incomplete applications. Please contact us immediately if you have missed the deadline but would still like to apply. Materials will not be returned.

Proposals will be reviewed by Taller Portobelo Norte Staff and a panel of invited artists and curators. Selected applicants will be notified by March 29th.
